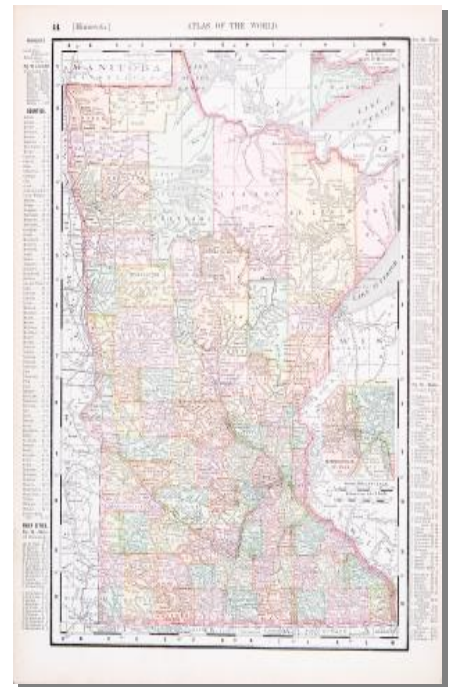
Social Security Contributes Billion\$ to Minnesota's Economy

In Minnesota there are **1,053,166** Social Security beneficiaries, including:

- 784,382 Retired Workers
- 118,405 Disabled Workers
- 55,062 Widow(er)s
- 37,897 Spouses
- 57,420 Children

Social Security benefits provide \$18 Billion each year to Minnesota's economy
