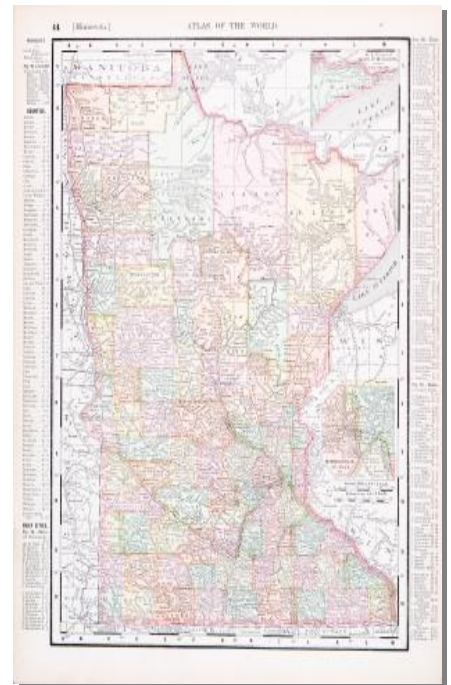
Social Security Contributes Billion\$ to Minnesota's Economy

In Minnesota there are **1,069,913** Social Security beneficiaries, including:

- 807,380 Retired Workers
- 116,968 Disabled Workers
- 53,387 Widow(er)s
- 34,587 Spouses
- 57,591 Children

Social Security benefits provide \$19 Billion each year to Minnesota's economy
