Reading the Scorecard

While members of Congress vote on an array of issues and no profile of a U.S. Representative or Senator is complete without consideration of all votes as well as work in committee and on constituent services, the National Committee legislative staff has identified votes in the 115th Congress (2017-2018) on issues it believes to be of particular importance to seniors.

Here’s how to use your members-only **Congressional Scorecard**. First, locate your State, then your Congressional District (CD) where you’ll see the name of your U.S. Representative. Next, locate your two U.S. Senators shown at the bottom of your State’s Scorecard section. Listed to the right of all their names are how they cast their votes on key bills, which are listed at the top of the page. Refer to list of “Votes Cast” to find out the title of the bill, how each bill could impact your earned benefits and your National Committee’s position.

A “Y” indicates a YES vote. An “N” indicates a NO vote. An “NV” indicates the member did not vote on the bill. A dash mark (“-”) indicates the vote took place before the member was sworn-in to his or her seat.

VOTES CAST IN THE UNITED STATES HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

HOUSE 2017 (First Session)

1. House Rule Against Disability Insurance Reallocation. (H. Res. 5) Adopting Rules for the 115th Congress – On Agreeing to the Resolution: A rule to prevent the House of Representatives from considering legislation to reallocate funds from the Social Security Old Age and Survivors Insurance (OASI) Trust Fund to the Disability Insurance Trust Fund unless accompanied by benefit cuts or tax increases that improve the solvency of the combined trust funds. This rule created an artificial crisis that could have resulted in Social Security retirement benefit cuts and a 19 percent cut in the benefits of 11 million workers with severe disabilities and their families. Roll Call #6, 1/3/17. **Passed: 234-193.** National Committee position: No.

2. American Health Care Act. (H.R. 1628) Repeal of the Affordable Care Act – On Passage of the Bill: This legislation weakens Medicare's solvency and leaves it vulnerable to benefit cuts and privatization, threatens access to Medicaid's long-term care benefits, significantly cuts the federal payment to state Medicaid programs, phases out the Medicaid expansion, repeals the Affordable Care Act's subsidies offsetting the cost of premiums, and requires "younger" seniors to pay more for less health care coverage. Roll Call #256, 5/4/17. **Passed: 217-213.** National Committee position: No.

3. 2018 Budget Resolution. (H.Con.Res. 71) On the Adoption of the Resolution: This budget ends traditional Medicare and turns Medicare into a voucher or coupon program. It raises the Medicare eligibility age to 67 and increases beneficiary out-of-pocket costs. It cuts Medicare by nearly \$500 billion over ten years and calls for fast track procedures designed to ram Social Security benefit cuts through Congress without public scrutiny. Roll Call #557, 10/5/2017. **Passed: 219-206.** National Committee position: No.

4. Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017. (H.R. 1) On Passage of the Bill: Does not offset \$1.5 trillion of the 2017 tax cut leaving Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid vulnerable to benefit cuts in the future because of this dramatic increase in the public debt. It repeals the medical expense deduction used by many retirees and moves to a slower inflation adjustment to calculate increases in tax brackets and the standard deduction, establishing a precedent for reducing the Social Security COLA. Roll Call #637, 11/16/17. **Passed: 227-205.** National Committee position: No.

5. Conference Agreement on Tax Legislation. (H.R. 1) On Passage of the Conference Report: Does not offset \$1.5 trillion of the 2017 tax bill, leaving Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid vulnerable to benefit cuts in the future because of this dramatic increase in the public debt. It undermines the health security of seniors not yet eligible for Medicare by repealing the Affordable Care Act's (ACA) individual mandate, raises ACA marketplace plan premiums, destabilizes the individual health insurance market, increases the number of uninsured by 13 million people, and approves a slower growth "chained" Consumer Price Index (CPI) to calculate increases in tax brackets and the standard deduction. Roll Call #699, 12/20/17. **Passed: 224-201.** National Committee position: No.

HOUSE 2018 (Second Session)

6. Strengthening Protections for Social Security Beneficiaries Act of 2017. (H.R. 4547) On Passage of the Bill: This bill reforms the representative payee system by increasing oversight of representative payees by the Protection and Advocacy system within each state. In addition, the legislation enables beneficiaries to designate their preferred payee in advance of actually needing one. Roll Call #51, 2/5/18. **Passed: 396-0.** National Committee position: Yes.

7. Balanced Budget Amendment to the United States Constitution. (H. J. Res. 2) On Passage of the Constitutional Amendment: The Amendment prevents Social Security and Medicare Part A from using trust fund surpluses to pay full benefits and hospitalization costs by requiring all federal expenditures to be covered by taxes collected in the same year. It also would require draconian cuts to Medicare Parts B, C and D, Medicaid, and many other programs. Roll Call #138, 4/12/18. **Failed to achieve the required 2/3 majority to approve a Constitutional amendment: 233-184.** National Committee position: No.

VOTES CAST IN THE UNITED STATES SENATE

SENATE 2017 (First Session)

8. Health Care Marketplace Overhaul - Motion to Proceed. (H.R. 1628) On the Motion to Proceed to the Bill: Allowed debate to begin on repeal of the Affordable Care Act. Roll Call #167, 7/25/17. **Passed with a tie-breaking “yea” vote from Vice President Pence: 51-50.** **National Committee position: No.**

9. Health Care Marketplace Overhaul – American Health Care Act. (H.R. 1628) On Passage of the Bill: Reduces the Medicare Part A Hospital Insurance trust fund’s solvency by repealing the ACA’s Hospital Insurance trust fund payroll tax, allows insurers to charge older enrollees five times more than younger ones, jeopardizes long-term care and other services by cutting the federal payment to state Medicaid programs, phases out the Medicaid expansion, and drives up seniors’ out-of-pocket costs by repealing the ACA’s subsidies offsetting the cost of premiums. Roll Call #179, 7/28/17. **Failed: 49-51.** **National Committee position: No.**

10. 2018 Budget Resolution. (H. Con. Res. 71) On the Adoption of the Resolution: Cuts Medicare by nearly \$500 billion and cuts Medicaid and the marketplace subsidies that make coverage affordable through the Affordable Care Act (ACA) by \$1.3 trillion. Funds domestic discretionary programs in 2027 18 percent below 2017 levels and fully 29 percent below 2010 levels, adjusted for inflation. These cuts undermine agencies and programs that provide crucial services to seniors and people with disabilities, including the Social Security Administration, Older Americans Act programs, Alzheimer’s disease and cancer research at the National Institutes of Health, Low Income Home Energy Assistance and housing assistance for low-income elderly persons. Enables filibuster-proof legislation to offer massive tax cuts for the wealthy and profitable corporations to be considered in the Senate. Roll Call #245, 10/19/17. **Passed: 51-49.** **National Committee position: No.**

11. Tax Cuts and Jobs Act – Senate Version. (H.R. 1) On Passage of the Bill: Fails to offset \$1.5 trillion of the tax bill’s nearly \$6 trillion cut in revenues leaving Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid vulnerable to benefit cuts because of its dramatic increase in the public debt, undermines the health security of seniors not yet eligible for Medicare by repealing the Affordable Care Act’s (ACA) individual mandate, raises ACA marketplace plan premiums, destabilizes the individual health insurance market, increases the number of uninsured by 13 million people, and moves to a slower growth “chained” Consumer Price Index (CPI) to calculate increases in tax brackets and the standard deduction. Roll Call #303, 12/2/17. **Passed: 51-49.** **National Committee position: No.**

12. Conference Agreement on Tax Legislation. (H.R. 1) On Passage of the Conference Report: Fails to offset \$1.5 trillion of the tax bill’s nearly \$6 trillion cut in revenues leaving Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid vulnerable to benefit cuts because of its dramatic increase in the public debt, undermines the health security of seniors not yet eligible for Medicare by repealing the Affordable Care Act’s (ACA) individual mandate, raises ACA marketplace plan premiums, destabilizes the individual health insurance market, increases the number

of uninsured by 13 million people, and moves to a slower growth “chained” Consumer Price Index (CPI) to calculate increases in tax brackets and the standard deduction. Roll Call #323, 12/20/17. **Passed: 51-48. National Committee position: No.**
